In other News- February 2021



As we near the one-year mark of a world-wide deadly and completely life-encompassing pandemic, we can take heart in knowing that both your Board of Deacons and Board of Management continue to meet monthly via Zoom.

The meetings are both encompassing and productive, making significant progress in updating our technology -*a necessity during these times* - setting the foundation for upcoming outreach programmes, and so much more.

Highlights of these meeting:

- Sandra Lyons and Charlotte Mandolesi agreed to Co-Chair the Board of Management.
- The Board of Management is seeking representation from the Youth Group.
- Recruitment for a part-time secretary is ongoing.
- An AV (Audio Visual) Committee is seeking members to advise on and operate UBC's AV equipment.
- Harry Davis, Sandra Lyons, Linda Mador, and Verna Scott have agreed to assist Nicole Rahaman with Tellering.
- February 26th is the launch date for the Afro-Caribbean Event video with community involvement.
- Updates were provided regarding the Website development.
- Discussion took place regarding groups returning physically to the church building. In-person worship services will commence the first Sunday of March. All gatherings must adhere to COVID protocols.
- For 2021, staff wages will increase by 1% and as per the increase in the cost of living.
- While year-end financials are, as yet, not complete, UBC ended the year in the red but in a more favourable position than the projected budget.
- The sub-committee of Susan Van Atte, Rod Stone and Steph Hattie will begin deliberating in early March on updating our present Constitution input from the church family is encouraged and welcomed. Copies of the current Constitution are available from the office.
- Discussion is ongoing regarding our 50+ year tradition of a combined Good Friday Service with Willowgrove United Church as it would be our turn to host. How best to proceed will be determined by Provincial Covid protocols at that time, as well as, hopefully, the soon arrival of Willowgrove's new pastor, the Rev. Hati Mvundura. Due to travel restrictions as well as unfavourable weather conditions, Pastor Mvundura, who is originally from Zimbabwe, and was pastoring a church in northern British Columbia, is yet to arrive.

The fate of our enjoying the much anticipated and appreciated hot cross buns remains uncertain.

• With numerous new names being added to our church family, the Care Call List is in the process of being up updated, expanded and revised.

The Season of Lent



According to the Miriam Webster Dictionary, <u>LENT</u> is the 40 weekday period from Ash Wednesday (February 17, 2021) until Easter Sunday (April 4, 2021) during which time some may choose to "give up" some earthly pleasure *think wine, chocolate, meat* - as a form of penance. During Lent, the cross is draped in purple, the colour of royalty, representing Jesus as the King of Kings.

For Easter Sunday, the cloth is white, signifying Christ's resurrection. Our cross at UBC, while not one that we traditionally see in photos, has its own special significance.

In past years, a large tree that filled the baptistery at Christmas, was donated by Hotchkiss Tree Farm and others, and was used for our Chrismon Tree.

Then, the branches were removed, and the trunk was made into a cross to be used at Lent. In the past decade, the decision was made to utilize the convenience of an artificial tree, so our present day cross is the trunk of our last "real" tree, and so, of special significance to the UBC Church Family.
