It was March 17th, 2020, when the Premier declared a State of Emergency for the Province of Ontario and every aspect of life *as we knew it* - forever changed.

Not that anyone's counting, but that was 470 days or - put another way - 1 year, 3 months and 18 days ago as of June 30, 2021. And, it is only in recent weeks, with Covid numbers falling and vaccinations increasing, as the province slowly awakens from shutdowns, Public Health protocols and restrictions, that possibilities of actual Good Mornings and Days are far more likely.

Ever cognizant and vigilant of Algoma Public Health Guidelines and Requirements, your Board of Deacons and Board of Management have continued to meet monthly via the safety of Zoom and express gratitude that such technology and options have been available to us.

## Following are some highlights of those meetings:

- With the great strides regarding Covid numbers being made in the province, the **Personnel** Committee is looking to safely resume in person interviews for church staff Office Secretary,
   Bookkeeper and Project Coordinator.
  - Alternative *at no cost* areas for posting the positions are further being sourced.
- Current **deficit** is approximately -\$9,000 to -\$10,000 with expenditures **covered** by funds in the current account.
- **Thank you** to the **Young Adult Group** for capably leading worship on two consecutive Sundays June 13th and 20th while Pastor Gabriel was taking some vacation time.
- With the opening of the economy (Phase One COVID re-opening and soon Phase 2), *upon request*, outside groups are being given permission and beginning to use the church building once again, always in accordance with Provincial Guidelines, APH requirements and established UBC COVID protocols.
- Increasing the church's **WiFi bandwidth** is being explored to support Live Streaming.
- As there are issues with floor in the main floor accessible washroom, its replacement will be overseen by the Property Committee. THANKS!

## Spring Assembly of the Northern Associations

On Saturday, May 29th, 2021, The **Northern Association of Baptist Churches** again held its Spring Assembly and AGM by **Zoom.** This marks the **second year in a row**, that the COVID -19 Pandemic has kept this assembly from congregating in the Sault -at The United Baptist Church.

Following the 9:30am welcome by **Moderator Dick Blackwell,** a Devotional by **Pastor Gabriel** and a time of Praise and Worship, attendees were afforded the opportunity to choose between 3 **Breakout Rooms.** 

Representing UBC as delegates were Pastor Gabriel, Rod Stone and Steph Hattie. Pastor Gabriel's and Steph's reports follow - Rod's on Technology will be in the July Issue.

Discussions on **LGBT+** matters within the Baptist churches occurred and was led by Pastor Patrick Garret of Immanuel Baptist Church, Blind River.

These spotlighted ways to move forward, considering the recent exit of Elliot Lake from CBOQ. How can our churches stay Christ-loving and welcoming without being judgmental? Taking into account the impact of other stakeholders: Human Rights organizations, community and the government may have about churches who refuse to make accommodations, and Pastors who have LGBT+ members within their own family circle. While **CBOQ does not support the LGBTQ+ lifestyle,** a committee will be looking into how member churches may choose to approach the matter individually.

Our approach is to love our neighbour and live our lives as guided by the word of God. We will find wisdom in His word - <u>Pastor Gabriel.</u>

### **Prioritizing Church Unity in COVID Controversies.**

This session, led by Pastor Stephen Speer of New Liskeard First Baptist and Rev. Kevin Serviss of Sudbury - First Baptist, focused on the differing points of view of individuals, groups, families and church families in regards to the mandated pandemic protocols, and how to maintain church (and family) unity in the light of these often, <u>hot-button issues.</u>



As an example of the challenges, one attendee to the session reported that his father had already had his first dose, and his mother **would not** be getting one at all!

The final consensus was to diligently and in prayer - try to see the other person's point of view- whether it related to the *wearing of masks, social distancing, getting the vaccine, the safely of the vaccine, medical and emotional concerns, sanitizing, or that the pandemic was even a true situation,* with compassion and respect, fully recognizing that it was not an issue that would easily be resolved. - **Steph Hattie.**
