# In Other News May, 2021 ...

No doubt, since March of 2020, some, or perhaps, many of us, may have - at some point - felt just like this gate. We have been challenged in ways we could never have even

begun to imagine - *a relatively short time in the whole scheme of things*- and yet it often seems like forever and ever ago at the same time.

And, in just recent weeks, here we are - everywhere you look, a myriad of vibrant colourful tulips dotting the landscape -tall and stately gently swaying in the breeze, the so delicate and elegant bleeding hearts branches - their graceful arches makes your heart skip a beat, the intoxicating aroma of lilacs evokes remembrance of the beautiful bouquets in the sanctuary each spring - Wilma Stone sharing with the church family from the trees in her yard, the grass even greener after each spring rainfall and the oh so vital dandelions - more numerous and resilient than ever!

Slowly, but surely with Covid numbers becoming more manageable, plans have been announced for the long awaited gradual reopening of the province. And, consistently, your Board of Deacons and Board of Management have held their monthly meetings to ensure the continually evolving and smooth functioning of the church via the safely of Zoom. **God is Good! All the time!** 

- Staff recruitment is ongoing for a part-time church secretary, bookkeeper, and Outreach Project Coordinator with delays the result of the COVID lockdown.
- Northern Association's Spring Assembly will take place via Zoom on Saturday, May 29th with Rod Stone and Steph Hattie as UBC's voting delegates. All are welcome and encouraged to participate *no cost involved* it's a rare opportunity to meet with others with whom we share our faith- all from the safety of our homes and no travelling required A link will be provided to join in.
- **Church Barbeque / Annual Meeting** is planned for September with more information to follow as we are permitted under provincial guidelines to meet in person again.
- An e-mail was received from **Samaritan's Purse** asking for prayers for India that is experiencing a devastating second wave for COVID *with the death toll surpassing 300,000.*
- We are looking forward to the **Youth** taking a Sunday Service while Pastor Gabriel is on vacation.
- While envelope receipts are up by approximately 7.9% over last year, the Treasurer reported a year-todate deficit of -\$10,262.08 (April 30, 2021 Financial Statement). However, due to funds carried forward from 2020 for Audio-Visual equipment and the Website, the overall deficit is -\$3,477.86. Of note, the Insurance Invoice for 2021 was paid early in the year (amount just under \$6,000).
- **Rod Stone** presented a very comprehensive and detailed update showcasing the progress, processes, frustrations and successes encountered in putting into place the above noted Audiovisual equipment and Website. Our <u>heartfelt thanks</u> to both **Rod** and **Roger Johns**, who have spent **countless hours-** researching what is needed, where and which options are best to purchase, making those purchases, and **then installing it all**! The end goal upon completion down the road -a quality system that will enable UBC to provide much needed and reliable up-to date outreach, not only for the benefit of our Church Family, but into our community and beyond.

Their skills and dedication are treasures beyond measure.

#### Taking the Temperature of our Church

This is the first in which I will discuss 15 questions proposed by the Canadian Baptists of Ontario and Quebec (CBOQ) in the topic "Taking the Temperature of your church", part of the series "Revitalizing Small Churches".

Your church leadership has joined this exciting initiative - a three year programme to improve Church life. UBC is one of six CBOQ churches that has made this commitment and the only one from Northern Ontario. We have witnessed what is happening in this church, are encouraged by the leading of the Holy Spirit and look forward with anticipation to what God has planned for us.

There were **two questions** that were part of "Taking the Temperature of Your church" that were discussed as the May Deacons' Board meeting. <u>They are:</u>

#### **1.** My church specifically prays for non-Christians to become followers of Christ.


2. Before we attempt any effort in my church, we cover it in prayer.

I would like you to take note of the words "my church "in both questions.

Does UBC pray for non-Christians to become followers of Christ? Does UBC pray before we attempt any effort?

These questions do not focus on what we do as individuals, but what we do **corporately**. <u>Corporate prayer</u> is the term used to describe **praying together with other people**, - in small groups or larger gatherings of people. Corporate prayer is an imprtant part of the life of the church . (from Lakeside Prayer Ministries)

Corporate prayer **unifies us with our purpose** (Acts 2:42) Yet, you may ask, "*Why can't I just pray by myself?*" You can. There is nothing in the Bible that says that corporate prayer has more power than individual prayer. But, when we **unite to pray** for specific requests, we are raising our prayers to God **in a voice of many** So it does not come down to "either", "or", rather, **pray without ceasing - corporately and individually.** 



We know that God hears our prayers. In his article **"Praying the Price,** Rev. Dr. Stuart Robinson outlines that throughout the history of the church, there has been a **direct correlation** between times of revival (**and God doing extraordinary things**), and prayer meetings where groups of people gathered together to pay- **God moved!** (*from Lakeside Prayer Ministry*)

With the preceeding as our guide, the Deacons' Board and the Board of Management, have prepared *and support* "**United Baptist Church-Prayer Points".** We ask that you **pray individually**,

as a family, in the twice monthly Praise and Prayer meetings, and with your United Baptist Church family for these Prayer Points.

We would also ask that you provide Pastor Gabriel with the **first name** of someone you would like us to pray for **to become** a **follower of Jesus Christ,** or **to return to the faith they have misplaced.** 

I pray that lifting our prayers to God for these indiviuals will produce results.

Rejoice always, **pray without ceasing**, give thanks in all circumstancse for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you. -1Thessalonians 5:16-18) (ESV) <u>Helping Hands</u> is a **Gore Street storefront** providing clothing and household items to low- income families and the homeless. Founded in April 2014, Helping Hands **recently received a charitable number- which allows them to give income tax receipts.** The organization does not receive ongoing financial support from outside organizations or governments, but is reliant on donations to cover expenses such as rent, public utilities and insurance. Items in the store are donated by members of the community with periodic announcements that the store is open to new donations (*space constraints limit when they open up to new donations*). Shoppers can make a donation for their purchases **but items are free to those who cannot afford to pay.** Helping Hands has not only provided warm clothing and footwear to those who have none but has also been instrumental in helping a number of homeless find housing.

On May 19<sup>th</sup>, **Wendy Gutcher** from Helping Hands was a guest speaker at the **Currie McPhail Women's Mission Circle Meeting.** Our Mission Circle supports International, National and Local Missions. In 2020, a portion of the proceeds



from our Fall Sale went to Helping Hands to assist them in covering expenses.

#### UBC's Mission Circle members are encouraged to target Helping Hands for their June 2021 offering.

Wendy noted that <u>as of May 25<sup>th</sup></u>, her organization would once again, be accepting donations of household items and clothing. Please consider taking **good quality** used items to Helping Hands as they continue to support the vulnerable in our community.

Hours of operation are Monday to Thursday, 10:00 a.m. to 1:45 p.m.

Wendy and her volunteers are exemplary of persons caring for others in our community. "Love your neighbour as yourself." - Luke 10: 27
