Unfortunately, because of the present situation, the **Chrismons**

(symbols of Christ) have not been added as they were not last year either.

Chrismon is the combination of parts of two words, CHRIst and MONogram. And it is just that, A Monogram of Christ. A requirement is that each Chrismon refer primarily to our Lord and Saviour and are all made in the combination of white and gold.



When all the **Chrismons** are on the tree, this exquisite **Crown,** adorns the top. It, and each of the equally amazingly handcrafted Chrismons, as seen in the photo of the tree, were the combined creative work of **Wilma Stone** and the **Flower Committee at that time**

The evergreen tree, which symbolizes the eternal life of our Saviour,

is the background for tiny white lights.

White suggests the **purity** and **perfection** of our Lord and the lights speak of Him who is the **Light of the World.**

We trust that our tree will contribute to the **spirit of worship** during this holy season.

In other News, November 2021

Every year, seemingly out of the blue, suddenly the season of **Advent is** here and 2021 is proving to be no exception.

The challenges of the past almost two years, and with the current alarming spike in numbers in our little corner of the world, there is no better time than now to welcome, embrace and celebrate this holy Season of Hope, Peace, Joy and Love.

In further fostering the practice of updating our church family with the work and progress of your **Board of Deacons** and **Board of Management,** following are highlights of their **November meetings**, as our ongoing practice since March 2020 - conducted through the safety of Zoom.

- The United Baptist Church website is nearing its launch (more information to follow).
- Due to the high COVID infection rates, **Coffee Hour** is currently **suspended**.
- A number of outside groups using the church have decided not to meet due to COVID.
 Upon reconvening, groups must adhere strictly to Algoma Public Health guidelines.
- As COVID in known to be an airborne virus, more readily transmitted in indoor spaces, it is strongly
 emphasized that the indoor wearing of masks in all areas of the church, at all times, as recommended
 by APH to keep everyone safe and protected, be respected.
- Our **thanks** to **Orv and Marie Shackleton**, who will once again, spearhead UBC's continuing participation as a **Christmas Cheer Depot** for pick up on **December 15th**.
- UBC is continuing to adhere to the currently required APH 30% capacity for attendance in the sanctuary and 20 persons in the basement hall. For this reason, registration may be required for the Christmas Eve Service, as COVID conditions and protocols at that time, will dictate the feasibility of an in-person Service.
- Watch for updates about future Baptisms. If you are interested in more information about baptism and/or church membership, **Pastor Gabriel** would love to hear from you.
- **Sharon Burns** and **Steph Hattie** are stepping down from the **Flower Committee.** They were thanked for their combined 50+ years of service.
- Christmas Cheer toy and gift card donations can be placed in the marked box in the Narthex up to the first week in December. Past that date, may be delivered to the Christmas Cheer depot in the former Wal-Mart site at Station Mall. Please inform Verna Scott if you do so.
- The Property Committee will seek quotes to replace the flooring in the main floor accessible washroom.
- For the 10 months ending October 31, 2021, **Total Revenue** was \$102,564.82 and **Total Expenditures** were \$103,643.48. **Net Income** was -\$1,078.66.



TAKING THE TEMPERTURE OF OUR CHURCH

The **sixth** in a series where we will discuss fifteen questions proposed by the **Canadian Baptists of Ontario & Quebec (CBOQ)** in the topic '**Taking the temperature of your church'**, part of the series *Revitalizing Small Churches*.



The statements that the Deacons' Board discussed at the November meeting, as follows:

People in my church share their faith regularly.

This is a good question to pose to the Deacons. How do we know the answer? In part, the answer lies in results, as if we share our faith then the next step may be to invite people to church. A better answer is **do people know we are Christians by our lives**, actions, and Christian morals? I recall from many decades ago the phrase WWJD. Remember? 'What would Jesus do'? If we reflect a life like our Saviour, then in a non-verbal way we share our faith. When we get asked, why are you doing this, then we have the door opened to share our faith verbally.

Members regularly invite quests to church.

I thought about this, the Deacons considered it, and if we were to change "Members" to "People in my church" the answer would be yes. At our in-person services, and I am not totally comfortable using this word, but "adherents" overwhelmingly outnumber members. Our "newcomers" (may I use this designation and when do they cease being new?) have been actively and regularly inviting guests and this has been growing our in-person attendance. Not to discount members but, if we share our faith the next step is an invitation to participate in our worship whether in person or online. I will admit that I am among the members that have not regularly invited guests.

A church does not grow without invitations and the Great Commission (Matthew 28:16-20) to make disciples of and <u>baptize</u> all nations in the name of the <u>Father</u>, the <u>Son</u>, and the <u>Holy Spirit</u>, is deterred.

This month (December) practice discipleship (being Christ like), share your faith through non-verbal actions (help a neighbour, help the poor, pray for the sick, pray for someone who needs Jesus in their life) and invite someone to join our service, whether regular Sunday or Christmas Eve ,either in person or live stream. May God bless your efforts.

Held on **Saturday, November 13th**, the women held a one-day *Sale for Missions*. In attendance were approximately **62 shoppers** who welcomed the opportunity to do some early Christmas Shopping. Available were baking, soups, chili, preserves, handmade crafts and paintings, a Treasure Section, as well as nearly new gift items. **COVID protocols** were followed in order to keep everyone safe, with those in attendance requiring pre-registration, a limited capacity of less than 20 total at a time in the lower hall, following the arrows, masking, hand sanitizing, social distancing and Covid screening.



It was most gratifying to receive such positive **feedback** about the entire experience and an *awesome*, and *then some*, approximately **\$5,200** was raised in support of projects serving vulnerable women and children in our community as well as special Mission projects identified by the Canadian Baptists of Ontario and Quebec, Women's Division.

Hope... Peace... Joy... Love ...



Christmas is the most **wonderful time of the year** - trees are trimmed, presents wrapped, cookies baked, and the chilly air and predictable snow signal the coming season of festive warmth and celebrations.

For us, as Christians, it all begins in 2021 on Sunday, November 28th and ends on Christmas Eve.

<u>Advent</u> is the first day of the church calendar year, and the beginning of the four weeks: a time of preparation for The Coming of the Messiah.

A symbol of Advent is the wreath, a continuous circle - with no beginning nor end, of greens, signifying continuous life - that is crowned with five candles and lit on consecutive Sundays.

<u>Ist Candle</u> -November 28th, 2021 - is purple-and represents HOPE <u>2nd Candle-December 5th</u>, 2021, also purple, represents PEACE <u>3rd Candle</u> - December 12, 202 is pink - presenting LOVE

4th Candle -December 19th, 2021, back to purple, representing JOY

<u>5th Candle</u> Christmas Eve, a **white** candle in the **centre**- the **Christ Candle**, which is used to light each person's individual candle, followed by the singing of "Silent Night" to end the Service.

UBC's Advent Wreath, was designed and donated by **Richard Dickson,** a long-time member choir member, in loving memory of his parents - **Norris and Ann Dickson**.
