



PRAYER CHANGES THINGS!

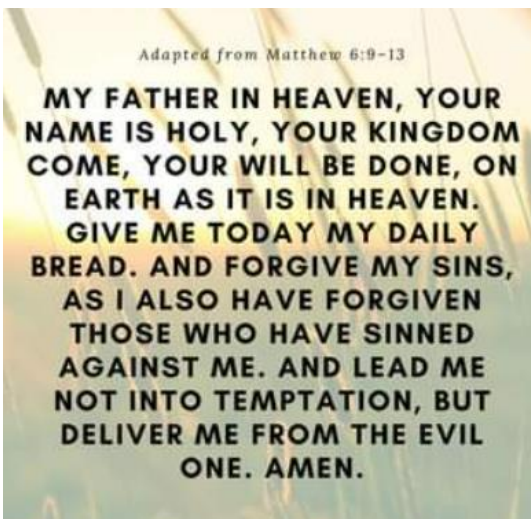

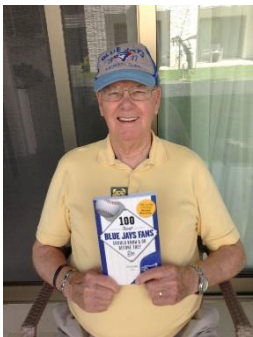
Iris is such a delightful lady, growing strong and lively. She is moving to Pathways.

How to write the right resume

There are thousands of templates for resumes available to you online. So which one works for you? Here are some questions to help you answer that:

What role am I applying for?

1. What can be readable for the recruiter?
2. How can I catch the right attention at first glance?

These are critical questions to ask and answer when you are putting a resume together.

Remember, it is recommended that you do not send the same blanket resume for all jobs. Your resumes should be tailor-made for each role. Note that does not mean you cannot send one resume for 2 similar jobs but what makes a difference is what exactly they are looking for. So a few tips for you friend!

Read the job Advert or job description well.

1. Highlight the top items that qualify you for the role on the first page of your resume.
2. Don't write 10 page resumes. That is too long
3. Ensure your resume is neat and legible and avoid typos, grammatical errors
4. Customize your resume for different positions.
5. No need to put in references. You can wait until you are asked, except when it is requested.

As they have since March, 2020, your Board of Deacons and Board of Management continued to meet *via Zoom*- the second and third Wednesday of each month, to consider and discuss all aspects and issues that make **UBC – UBC**.

While both Boards will be taking a break during July, and will resume in August to prepare for the upcoming year, a meeting will be held at the **Call of the Chair** should a need arise.

Some highlights of those meetings:

- **Vacation Bible School Camp** is proposed for July with a theme of “**Under the Sea**”. **Shelly Bazil-Smith** is coordinating this activity for children from JK to Grade 6 and seeking the help of **volunteers**.
- **Activities** for the CBOQ funded Outreach Project are **on hold** until a new Coordinator is hired. To date, two Young Adult Events and a Men’s Breakfast have been held.
- **Volunteers** are needed to supervise the Nursery **during Coffee Hour**.
- **Volunteers** are needed to **support Coffee Hour** after church on Sundays.
- The Board approved use of the church basement by the **Chouinard family** and for **Horticultural Society Executive** meetings.
- Supported was **prayer in** the Morden Room, **preceding the morning worship service**.
- Approved was the purchase of a **refurbished iPad** for the second Sunday School room. **Painting** of the second Sunday School room is expected to take place over the summer months.
- Owner of the strip mall west of the church has requested to **buy the parking area** behind his buildings (*property currently owned by the church*). This will be noted at the Annual Meeting with more investigation needed before any decision. **Prayerful consideration is requested**.
- Owner of **Tilley Road Veterinary Clinic** has requested to use **parking spaces** in the west UBC parking lot for their staff. Rod Stone will investigate this request.
- The **updated Constitution** entitled **Principles and Guidelines** will be presented to the membership for approval at the Annual Meeting.
- As of the end of May 2022, **Total Revenue** was \$61,550.04 and Total Expenditures were \$62,559.98 leaving a Net Income of - \$1,009.94.
- At the end of May 2022, **Total Assets** have increased by \$15,000 as compared to 2021.
- The Board approved the **proposed 2022 Budget**, to go before the membership at the Annual Meeting.

It's summer, and time to enjoy all that Sault Ste. Marie and Algoma have to offer.

Every **Saturday and Sunday** throughout the summer, **Sault Transit** will offer service to **Pointe Des Chenes** day park. Two buses per day will operate from the downtown terminal on weekends *with a transfer at Sault College*, including those statutory holidays on which Transit operates

The regular fee is **\$3.05 each way for adults** and **children under the age of 12**, when accompanied by responsible (aged 16 or older) adult, are **free**.

Important to Note: there is **no lifeguard** on duty and *all Transit rules apply*.

The city has also started its summer **Best for Kids** program, which provides **free transit** for one adult and children to access some of the **city's best family attractions**, including the pump track, skateboard park, splash pad, and Manzo and Greco pools. **Customers must inform the driver upon entry in order to receive this service.**
