

Following are some highlights of the most recent **Board of Deacons** and **Board of Management** Minutes as they faithfully meet the 2nd and 3rd Wednesday of each month, beginning at 6:00pm on Zoom.

Deep appreciation to **Mary Ellen Johns** and **Susan Van Atte** for their diligence and expertise in preparing these Minutes as well as **members of both boards** for their continuing dedication and time given.

- Work continues to develop a **Policy for Weddings** at UBC.
- Updates were provided regarding two teams of volunteers providing assistance with cleaning.
- Pastor Gabriel will host a plenary session at the upcoming Canadian Baptists of Ontario and Quebec (CBOQ) June Assembly in Toronto; a first ever for UBC! And Teni Araba will participate on a panel for Pastors' wives another first!
- Pastor Gabriel, Rod Stone (Chair of Board of Deacons), and Steph Hattie (Northern Association Rep) will be attending the
 upcoming Northern Association Spring Assembly of Baptist Churches on May 12th and 13th in Sudbury (First Church
 Garson). UBC can send two additional voting delegates whose expenses are reimbursed. Interested? Contact Rod
 Stone or Pastor Gabriel.
- For March 2023, **Total Revenue** was \$16,092.48 (**65.57% increase** over the same period last year) and **Total Expenditures** were \$13,847.61 (**42.71% more** than the same period last year) leaving a **Net Income** of \$2.244.87.
- The good news is that for the 3 months ending March 31st, the overall Net Income was \$8,881.03.

 A follow-up congregational meeting is to be held on Sunday, May 7th in the sanctuary following the morning service to discuss revisions to the 2023 budget.
- At the Social Committee's suggestion, a water cooler will replace the purchase of water bottles, which are costly, will
 deter the present significant wastage that is occurring, ease the workload of our dedicated Social Committee and help
 the environment! Win/Win/Win!
- The Board approved the detailed and impressive **Outreach Committee's** report to CBOQ for the period of 6 months ending March 31, 2023 a requirement of receiving the grant.
- The Board approved a **Confidentiality Policy for the Care Team**; noted that **additional volunteers are needed**. *Expectation is that training of volunteers will take place in May*.
- A Request for Proposals (RFPs) will be issued shortly for brick repairs to the church tower and for corners of the building.
- Quotes were reviewed for the replacement of carpet with approval to proceed with replacement of carpet in the sanctuary, narthex, and hallway leading to the offices; costs to be partially covered by Savings.
- The Board approved expenditures for painting in the Narthex, washrooms, stairwells, and lower hall.
- A Fundraising Campaign is needed to cover Capital Expenditures such as the replacement of carpets, painting, tower repairs, and more the wish list that will be discussed on May 7th.

Plan to attend and be a part of the discussion and the solution.



TWO New at UBC

 A new and improved recycling area is now once again available in the lower hall.

WHAT are we collecting and WHY?





Aluminum pop tabs are collected by **The March of Dimes** and recycled to generate funds to buy, repair and maintain a wide variety of **mobility/assistive equipment**, empowering people with disabilities through research, education and advocacy, as well as supporting families through vital facilities such as Ronald MacDonald House. **DID YOU KNOW?** A million pop tabs weigh about 800 pounds /363 KG and are worth \$366 US.



Locally owned and operated, **Lock City Dairies** has partnered with the **Sault Ste. Marie Humane Society** to provide funds for every **outer milk bag** collected, avoiding these plastics going into the landfill, as well as ensuring the Humane Society of needed **funds for support of the animals** for such necessary expenses as food, pet toys, blankets, beds and always in demand - **expensive veterinary costs.**



Stamp out Poverty with your old Stamps is the motto of **Oxfam**, an international non-profit organization operating in over 87 countries worldwide. **Oxfam Canada** alone, in 2021, generated nearly \$30,000 for the cause. Their **focus** is on the **needs of women and girls** – **fighting poverty** and **injustice** and **promoting rights**. Not only do they collect stamps- *preferably trimmed to 1 cm* - also the entire envelope if there are clearly identifiable town/village/city postmarks as well as registered or special delivery postmarks.

Gender is the most persistent predictor of poverty and powerlessness in our world today.



Since 1925, the 1.4 million members of the 48,000 Lions Clubs around the word have been champions in helping combat vision impairment, blindness and hearing loss, by providing care, education and access to glasses and hearing aids that might otherwise be out of reach for many worldwide.

Our **local Lions Club** is also actively involved in the **Annual Rose Day** in May, where bouquets of roses, carnations or a mixed bouquet can be ordered and will personally be delivered by a Lions' member to the recipient of your choice. The funds raised are used to support a **Vision Screening** programme for **Senior Kindergarten** pupils, now expanded to Junior Kindergarten as part of their **Eye See Eye Learn** Programme, occurring annually from October to April.



Our local Soup Kitchen Community Centre. Located on James Street in the west end of the city, is one of the numerous organizations that is striving to provide vital food security for residents of our city and surrounding area. Soup Kitchen Director, Ron Simms, has indicated that while any and all non-perishables food is welcomed, their present greatest need is for canned milk, Peanut Butter, Crackers and Kraft Dinner.
